## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

All plaques are individually numbered and details will be kept in a national register.

Vehicles receiving a plaque must be 100 years old and manufactured not later than December 31, 1918

The Veteran Car Club of SA is responsible for determining, assessing and identifying the eligibility of the vehicle covered by this application.

The recipient of the plaque must acknowledge that the plaque “belongs to the car” and if the car is sold, then the plaque is to go with the car. The plaque is not to be sold separate from its vehicle. Should the car be written off or otherwise cease to exist at any point from the time of issuing the plaque, then the plaque **MUST BE** returned to the issuing club for cancellation.

Each eligible car can receive only one plaque. In the exceptional circumstance of a plaque being lost or stolen, the owner or custodian at the time may apply for a replacement stating the circumstances of the loss. The VCCSA will then make a decision on whether the plaque will be replaced.

Only the year and make of the vehicle will be inscribed on the front of the plaque. Any additional inscribing, such as engine and chassis number and owner name at the time of presentation, will be inscribed on the rear of the plaque.

In awarding the plaque the issuing club (VCC-SA) makes no warranties or representations as to the age of the vehicle.
