The GM Owners' Day event will still be held this year, and although two years ago we celebrated 70 years of Holden cars, they will be around for a good number of years yet, even gaining some status, like a former Prime Minister whose faults are forgotten and achievements lauded, to the point of having a school named after him. We have two such in WA already.



Holden Highlights

Since the release of the 48/215 Holden in November 1948 there has been a multitude of models and names associated with the brand. It's impossible to catalogue all of these in this magazine, so here goes with the Editor's choice of favourite Holdens. Bear in mind that for a time he was an avid Chrysler Valiant man but owned an EK ute, EH sedan, One Tonne and HZ Kingswood utes. He eschewed the Ford range until driving many of this brand during his working life. He still drives a Falcon ute. Now, many Chevrolet addicts would wonder why we are giving space to this now defunct name. Well, after all, Holden is like our dear little sister, tolerated and patronized.

The first two models of the marque, the 48/215 and FJ, were styled on past Chevrolets, so didn't win prizes for their looks, but because of their Australian built origin and reliability sold very well. Along came the FE and FC range in the mid 50s and were right up to the styling mark. My favourite was the FC.

The less said about the FB/EK models the better, being styling leftovers from the 50s, pudgy and underpowered with the first auto transmissions. The EJ had style but still kept the old grey motor. Who wouldn't have wanted an EH with the new 179 motor? It looked good too. Then followed a number of models which were just plain boring, until the first Monaro arrived. It was a hit with the young brigade, until they married and had to make room for the kids.

The Kingswood style lasted a long while, but it was one of my faves. The HZ ute was to me the best proportioned and attractive model since the FC. Mine did 300,000 kms on the first engine.

Meanwhile, Holden brought out the Torana. Ahh, the XU1's throaty roar was pleasing to the ears while later models took on all comers and kept winning races. It made Peter Brock a household name.

What can I say about the Commodore, apart from the fact that some were very good and others pretty ordinary. A major failing is that they were very easy to steal, as my son found out one night (no, it was his that was pinched). Like them or not, the Commodore has made its mark in Australian motoring. The early ones were much smaller than the Kingswood, but grew more bulky and heavy over time. Well, haven't we all.



What about the Holden models that didn't set you on fire? Well, the Holden Brougham (pronounced 'broom' as per the horse drawn carriage) and the later Kingswood Caprice, were just bog standard cars with longer boots, trying to compete with the Ford Fairlane.

The Gemini was a very ordinary little car which tried to look bigger, and what positive thing can you say about the Camira? Supposed to be a 'world car', the engine was guaranteed to smoke by the 60,000 km mark, and the resale value fell like a rock.

The Commodore utes were nothing very inspiring as their load capacity didn't match the Ford. But they appealed to the young, especially the Maloo.

Looking to the future, we can expect various Chevrolet models to arrive in Australia, but with the cost of conversion to RHD they will be limited to the higher priced range.

It's been a long ride with Holden, but the end of the road is here.

General Motors Specialty Vehicles

With the Holden name to be retired by the end of this year, General Motors is considering a new sub-brand called **General Motors Specialty Vehicles (GMSV)** that would sell selected US models – most of which will be converted to right-hand-drive by the company formerly known as <u>Holden Special Vehicles</u>, and which currently imports the <u>Chevrolet Camaro</u> muscle car and <u>Chevrolet Silverado</u> pick-up.

The Camaro and Silverado are currently sold through 65 of Holden's 204 dealers nationally. It is unclear which of those dealers will continue under the proposed GMSV name and new arrangements.

While the new deal would initially apply to existing models such as the Chevrolet Camaro SS, Chevrolet Camaro ZL1, Chevrolet Silverado 2500 and upcoming Chevrolet Silverado 1500, other models out of the US are expected to follow.

Options include the Chevrolet Tahoe and Suburban seven-seat SUVs, as well as certain Cadillac SUVs that share their underpinnings. There is also the possibility the electric Hummer pick-up – due to go into production in the US two years from now – could be sold in Australia some time down the road if converted to right-hand-drive locally.

The introduction of the GMSV sub-brand also solves the problem of what badge to sell the iconic Chevrolet Corvette sports car under. It is due in Australian showrooms next year but will be factory-built in right-hand-drive. Its rear-engine layout made the conversion easier and more affordable on this model.
